9 cited as the “Gaylord Nelson Apostle Islands National  
10 Lakeshore Wilderness Act”.

11 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

12 (1) MAP.—The term “map” means the map en-  
13 titled “Apostle Islands Lakeshore Wilderness”, num-  
14 bered 633/80,058 and dated September 17, 2004.

15 (2) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means  
16 the Secretary of the Interior.

17 (3) HIGH-WATER MARK.—The term “high-  
18 water mark” means the point on the bank or shore  
19 up to which the water, by its presence and action or  
20 flow, leaves a distinct mark indicated by erosion, de-  
21 struction of or change in vegetation or other easily  
22 recognizable characteristic.

23 (c) DESIGNATION OF APOSTLE ISLANDS NATIONAL  
24 LAKESHORE WILDERNESS.—

(A.

1           (1) DESIGNATION.—Certain lands comprising  
2           approximately 33,500 acres within the Apostle Is-  
3           lands National Lakeshore, as generally depicted on  
4           the map referred to in subsection (b), are hereby  
5           designated as wilderness in accordance with section  
6           3(c) of the Wilderness Act (16 U.S.C. 1132), and  
7           therefore as components of the National Wilderness  
8           Preservation System.

9           (2) MAP AND DESCRIPTION.—

10           (A) The map referred to in subsection (b)  
11           shall be on file and available for public inspec-  
12           tion in the appropriate offices of the National  
13           Park Service.

14           (B) As soon as practical after enactment  
15           of this section, the Secretary shall submit a de-  
16           scription of the boundary of the wilderness  
17           areas to the Committee on Energy and Natural  
18           Resources of the Senate and the Committee on  
19           Resources of the United States House of Rep-  
20           resentatives.

21           (C) The map and description shall have  
22           the same force and effect as if included in this  
23           section, except that the Secretary may correct  
24           clerical and typographical errors in the descrip-  
25           tion and maps.

1           (3) BOUNDARY OF THE WILDERNESS.—Any  
2           portion of wilderness designated in paragraph (c)(1)  
3           that is bordered by Lake Superior shall use as its  
4           boundary the high-water mark.

5           (4) NAMING.—The wilderness area designated  
6           by this section shall be known as the Gaylord Nelson  
7           National Wilderness. (A.)

8           (d) ADMINISTRATION.—

9           (1) MANAGEMENT.—Subject to valid existing  
10          rights, the lands designated as wilderness by this  
11          section shall be administered by the Secretary in ac-  
12          cordance with the applicable provisions of the Wil-  
13          derness Act (16 U.S.C. 1131), except that—

14                (A) any reference in that Act to the effec-  
15                tive date shall be considered to be a reference  
16                to the date of enactment of this section; and

17                (B) where appropriate, any reference to  
18                the Secretary of Agriculture shall be considered  
19                to be a reference to the Secretary on the Inte-  
20                rior with respect to lands administered by the  
21                Secretary.

22          (2) SAVINGS PROVISIONS.—Nothing in this sec-  
23          tion shall—

24                (A) modify, alter, or in any way affect any  
25                treaty rights;

1 (B) alter the management of the waters of  
2 Lake Superior within the boundary of the Apos-  
3 tle Islands National Lakeshore in existence on  
4 the date of enactment of this section; or

5 (C) be construed to modify, limit, or in any  
6 way affect the use of motors on the lake waters,  
7 including snowmobiles and the beaching of mo-  
8 torboats adjacent to wilderness areas below the  
9 high water mark, and the maintenance and ex-  
10 pansion of any docks existing at the time of the  
11 enactment of this section.

12 ~~SEC. 142.~~ If the Secretary of the Interior has trans-  
13 ferred a grazing permit for lands adjacent to the Mojave  
14 National Preserve, upon request of the permittee the Sec-  
15 retary shall also issue a special use permit for that portion  
16 of the grazing allotment located within the Preserve. The  
17 special use permit shall be issued with the same terms and  
18 conditions as the most recently-issued permit for that al-  
19 lotment and the Secretary shall consider the permit to be  
20 one transferred in accordance with section 325 of Public
