3 (2) DESCRIPTION OF LAND.—The parcel of
4 land referred to in paragraph (1) is the approxi-
5 mately 150 acres of Bureau of Land Management
6 land in Clark County, Nevada, as generally depicted
7 on the map entitled “Veterans Administration Con-
8 veyance” and dated September 24, 2004.

9 (3) USE OF LAND.—The parcel of land de-
10 scribed in paragraph (2) shall be used by the Sec-
11 retary of Veterans Affairs for the construction and
12 operation of medical and related facilities, as deter-
13 mined to be appropriate by the Secretary of Vet-
14 erans Affairs.

15 SEC. ~~147~~. CUMBERLAND ISLAND WILDERNESS
16 BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT. (a) IN GENERAL.—Public Law
17 97–250 (96 Stat. 709) is amended by striking section 2
18 and inserting the following:

19 **“SEC. 2. CUMBERLAND ISLAND WILDERNESS.**

20 “(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

21 “(1) MAP.—The term ‘map’ means the map en-
22 titled ‘Cumberland Island Wilderness’, numbered
23 640/20,038I, and dated September 2004.

24 “(2) SECRETARY.—The term ‘Secretary’ means
25 the Secretary of the Interior.

1 “(3) WILDERNESS.—The term ‘Wilderness’
2 means the Cumberland Island Wilderness estab-
3 lished by subsection (b).

4 “(4) POTENTIAL WILDERNESS.—The term ‘Po-
5 tential Wilderness’ means the 10,500 acres of poten-
6 tial wilderness described in subsection (c)(2), but
7 does not include the area at the north end of Cum-
8 berland Island known as the ‘High Point Half-Moon
9 Bluff Historic District’.

10 “(b) ESTABLISHMENT.—

11 “(1) IN GENERAL.—Approximately 9,886 acres
12 of land in the Cumberland Island National Seashore
13 depicted on the map as ‘Wilderness’ is designated as
14 a component of the National Wilderness Preserva-
15 tion System and shall be known as the ‘Cumberland
16 Island Wilderness’.

17 “(2) EXCLUSIONS.—The 25-foot wide roadways
18 depicted on the map as the ‘Main Road’, ‘Plum Or-
19 chard’, and the ‘North Cut Road’ shall not be in-
20 cluded in the Wilderness and shall be maintained by
21 the Secretary for continued vehicle use.

22 “(c) ADDITIONAL LAND.—In addition to the land
23 designated under subsection (b), the Secretary shall—

24 “(1) on acquisition of the approximately 231
25 acres of land identified on the map as ‘Areas Be-

1 come Designated Wilderness upon Acquisition by the
2 NPS'; and

3 “(2) on publication in the Federal Register of
4 a notice that all uses of the approximately 10,500
5 acres of land depicted on the map as ‘Potential Wil-
6 derness’ that are prohibited under the Wilderness
7 Act (16 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.) have ceased, adjust the
8 boundary of the Wilderness to include the land.

9 “(d) AVAILABILITY OF MAP.—The map shall be on
10 file and available for public inspection in the appropriate
11 offices of the National Park Service.

12 “(e) ADMINISTRATION.—Subject to valid existing
13 rights, the Wilderness shall be administered by the Sec-
14 retary, in accordance with the applicable provisions of the
15 Wilderness Act (16 U.S.C. 1131 et seq.) governing areas
16 designated by that Act as wilderness areas, except that—

17 “(1) any reference in such provisions to the ef-
18 fective date of that Act shall be deemed to be a ref-
19 erence to the effective date of this Act; and

20 “(2) where appropriate, any reference in that
21 Act to the Secretary of Agriculture shall be deemed
22 to be a reference to the Secretary.

23 “(f) EFFECT.—Any person with a right to utility
24 service on Cumberland Island on the date of enactment
25 of this subsection shall continue to have the right to utility

1 service in the Wilderness after the date of enactment of
2 this subsection.

3 “(g) MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR ACCESS TO MAIN
4 ROAD AND NORTH CUT ROAD.—Not later than one year
5 after the date of the enactment of the Cumberland Island
6 Wilderness Boundary Adjustment Act of 2004, the Sec-
7 retary shall complete a management plan to ensure that
8 not more than 8 and not less than 5 round trips are made
9 available daily on the Main Road north of the Plum Or-
10 chard Spur and the North Cut Road by the National Park
11 Service or a concessionaire for the purpose of transporting
12 visitors to and from the historic sites located adjacent to
13 Wilderness.”.

14 (b) TOURS OF CUMBERLAND ISLAND NATIONAL SEA-
15 SHORE.—Section 6 of Public Law 92–536 (86 Stat. 1066)
16 is amended—

17 (1) in subsection (b), by inserting “, except as
18 provided in subsection (c),” before “no development
19 of the project”; and

20 (2) by adding at the end the following:

21 “(c) TOURS OF THE SEASHORE.—Notwithstanding
22 subsection (b), the Secretary may enter into not more than
23 3 concession contracts, as the Secretary determines appro-
24 priate, for the provision of tours for visitors to the sea-
25 shore that are consistent with—

1 “(1) this Act;

2 “(2) the Wilderness Act (16 U.S.C. 1131 et
3 seq.); and

4 “(3) Public Law 97-250 (96 Stat. 709).”

5 SEC. 148. Notwithstanding any other provision of
6 law, the National Park Service final winter use rules pub-
7 lished in Part VII of the Federal Register for November
8 10, 2004, 69 Fed. Reg. 65348, et seq., shall be in force
9 and effect for the winter use season of 2004-2005 that
10 commences on or about December 15, 2004.
